What are the steps to change my sex/gender marker in Travis County, Texas?

These instructions are to request a court order to change your sex/gender identifier. If you want to change your sex/gender identifier AND also your name, there are separate instructions and forms for that. Note: These forms are intended for use in **Travis County**, **Texas**.

Please note that there is a new policy at Vital Statistics and at the Texas Department of Public Safety that those agencies will not accept gender marker change orders.

Step 1. Fill out two forms.

Petition to Change the Sex/Gender Identifier of an Adult.

Final Order to Change the Sex /Gender Identifier of an Adult.

Where do I get the forms?

You can print forms from the Law Library's website at www.TravisCountyLawLibrary.org.

If you cannot afford to pay a filing fee, you can ask to waive the fee by filing a *Statement of Inability to Afford Payment of Court Costs* form.

Step 2. Gather the additional paperwork.

You will need a letter from a medical doctor.

The letter should say that:

- The doctor has examined you,
- You have received appropriate clinical treatment for transitioning, and
- Granting a change of gender/sex marker is in your best interest.

You may also need this paperwork:

- A Statement of Inability to Afford Payment of Court Costs form (if you want to ask that filing fees be waived).
- A copy of your certificate of discharge (if you were convicted of a felony and served time in prison).
- A copy of your discharge from felony probation (if you successfully completed probation)
- A copy of your Sex Offender Update Form (if you are required to register as a sex offender)

Step 3. Get your fingerprints taken.

Have your **fingerprints** taken. You will need the fingerprint card to file with your *Petition*.

Do you want your forms reviewed by an attorney?

- You can hire a private attorney. There are attorneys in Austin who specialize in LGBT+ legal matters.
- The Travis County Law Library can review your forms.
- The University of Texas Law School holds a legal clinic each semester. The clinic volunteers will help you fill out the paperwork.

Where do I get my fingerprints taken?

Check with local law enforcement to learn where you can have your fingerprints taken. There is a fee, around \$20. In Travis County, you can have your fingerprints taken at Passport Express at 1107 Rio Grande, Austin, Texas 78701.

Step 4. File your Petition.

You can file the *Petition* in the District Clerk's Office, 1700 Guadalupe 3rd floor or online.

File these attachments with your *Petition*:

- Your proposed Final Order to Change the Sex /Gender Identifier of an Adult.
- The fingerprint card. Make sure:
 - o the image of your fingerprint card is legible.
 - You signed the card where indicated.
- The letter from your medical doctor.
- A Statement of Inability to Afford Payment of Court Costs form (if you want to ask that filing fees be waived)
- Exhibit: A copy of your certificate of discharge (if you were convicted of a felony)
- Exhibit: A copy of your discharge from felony probation (if you completed probation)
- Exhibit: A copy of your Sex Offender Update Form (if you are required to register as a sex offender).

Note: You can file your Petition online www.eFileTexas.gov. If you file online:

- 1. Make sure you scan and upload your fingerprint card, the medical letter, and the exhibits (if applicable) with your *Petition*.
- 2. Fill out and upload your proposed Final Order to Change the Sex /Gender Identifier of an Adult.
- 3. Include instructions in the 'Comments' section that you would like your paperwork forwarded to the court for consideration.

Step 5. Pay the Filing Fee.

You will **pay a filing fee** of about \$350 at the Travis County District Clerk's Office.

If paying the fee will create a financial hardship for you and your family, you may file a *Statement of Inability to Afford Payment of Court Costs* form to ask the Court to waive court and filing fees.

Step 6. Wait for a Notice from the Court.

Court cases take some time to process. The average time for Gender Identifier case to be finished is around four months.

Once the Judge signs your order, the court will send you a Notice of Order. These notices are sent through email or postal mail.

If you have reached the 4-month mark without any contact from the Court, or if you have concerns about your filing, you can contact the Travis County Law Library to check on your case. After four months have passed since the original or any subsequent amended filings, we can reach out to the clerk's office on your behalf. Law Library: 512-854-8677.

Step 7. Get certified copies of the Order.

Go to the District Clerk's Office, 1700 Guadalupe 3rd floor. The Clerk's Office stamps the Order signed by the judge.

Ask for a **certified copy** of the signed and stamped Order. Pay the fee for the certified copy. You will need the certified copies to prove that the Court ordered the identifier change. You may want to get at least 3 certified copies.

You can also purchase certified copies <u>online</u> from the District Clerk's Office.

Step 8. Notify.

Notify agencies of your identifier change. You may be required to show them a certified copy of your court order. Agencies to notify include the:

- Social Security Administration
- Tax Office (vehicle and voter registration)
- County Clerk's Office (property titles)
- Passport Office

As of August 2024, Vital Statistics (birth certificates) and the Texas Department of Public Safety (driver's license) no longer accept court orders to change gender markers on birth certificates and driver's licenses. Contact Lambda Legal at lambdalegal.org/helpdesk if you have questions or concerns about notifying Texas state agencies.

Questions: Gender Marker/Sex Identifier Change

- Q. Can I change my gender marker on my Texas driver's license? Can I change my gender marker on my birth certificate?
- A. No. As of August 2024, both the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) and Texas Vital Statistics have policies that the agencies will no longer accept gender marker changes. You may want to contact the Lambda Legal help desk at lambdalegal.org/helpdesk before contacting DPS.
- Q. Who can use these forms?
- A: This form is intended for use by people who want to change the sex identifier on their public documents to match their gender identity. If you want to change your name AND gender marker, there are separate forms for that. There are also separate forms if you want to just change your name.
- Q, Can I change my gender/sex marker on public documents without going to court?
- A: No. In Texas, you need a court order. Judges have discretion to either grant or deny your request.
- Q: Is surgery or other medical treatment or procedure required before I can change my gender/sex marker?
- A: No, surgery is not required by Texas law. What is required is a narrative statement from your medical doctor that says:
 - The doctor has examined you.
 - You have received appropriate treatment to transition.
 - It is in your best interest (it is recommended) that your sex and/or gender marker be changed in public records to be consistent with your identity and presentation.

In exercising their discretion to grant sex/gender marker changes, judges often look to the Current Standards of Care (SOC) established by the World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH).

- Q: Can I change my gender/sex marker to non-binary or some other identity that is neither male or female (M or F)?
- A: No. Texas law does not recognize non-binary, third gender or gender fluid as an acceptable entry for sex or gender that is printed on state identification documents.
- Q: Will my identity documents automatically be updated once the court enters an order?
- A: No. Getting an order is just the first step of the process of correcting your gender marker on your ID documents. You will need to contact the issuing authority for each type of ID and present a certified copy of the court order when you ask for a change. You can get a certified copy of the order signed by the judge from the District Clerk's Office 1700 Guadalupe 3rd floor.
 - Although the order is a binding order of a Texas district court of general jurisdiction, it is not an absolute guarantee that state entities will immediately adjust your gender marker in accordance with the order.
 - As of August 2024, both the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) and Texas Vital Statistics have policies that the agencies will no longer accept gender marker changes. You may want to contact the help desk at Lambda Legal 214-219-8585 before contacting DPS.
