# What are the steps to change a minor's sex/gender marker in Travis County, Texas?

These instructions are to change a minor's sex/gender identifier on Texas state records. A minor is someone younger than 18 years old. If you want to change both the sex/gender identifier AND the minor's name, there are separate instructions and forms for that.

Note: These forms are intended for use in uncontested cases in **Travis County**, **Texas**.

The Final Order to Change the Sex/Gender Identifier of a Minor is a court order and a judicial finding of sex/gender. It gives notice to agencies and departments within the court's jurisdiction of the change of sex/gender identification. It does not take away any legal rights or responsibilities under the original sex identifier. It does not grant any new rights. Changing the identifier will NOT allow the minor to escape civil or criminal responsibility. You will still be held responsible for any debts the minor may have under the original identifier.

## Step 1. Fill out two forms.

Petition to Change the Sex/Gender Identifier of a Minor. This form asks the judge to order agencies to change the sex/gender identifier of the minor on official documents. The petitioner(s), the person(s) asking on behalf of the minor, must sign this form under penalty of perjury.

Final Order to Change the Sex /Gender Identifier of a Minor. The judge signs this form to order agencies to change the minor's identifier on official documents. The petitioner(s) must sign this form.

# Where do I get the forms?

# Step 2. Gather the additional paperwork.

You will need a letter from a medical doctor. The letter should say that:

- The writer has examined the minor,
- The minor has received appropriate clinical treatment for transitioning, and
- Granting a change of gender/sex marker is in the minor's best interest.

You may also need this paperwork:

- Statement of Consent of Minor for Change of Sex/Gender Identifier.
  - If the minor is 10 years old or older, the minor must sign this form.
  - If the minor is 9 years old or younger, this form is optional.
- A Statement of Inability to Afford Payment of Court Costs form (if you want to ask that filing fees be waived)
- A copy of the Sex Offender Update Form (if the minor is required to register as a sex offender)

# Do you want your forms reviewed by an attorney?

- You can hire a private attorney. There are attorneys in Austin who specialize in LGBT+ legal matters.
- The Law Library can review your forms at 1700 Guadalupe St.. 2<sup>nd</sup> floor.
- The University of Texas Law School holds a legal clinic each semester. The clinic volunteers will help you fill out the paperwork.

# Step 3. File the Petition.

File the *Petition* in the District Clerk's Office, 1700 Guadalupe St., 3<sup>rd</sup> floor.

File these attachments with the *Petition*:

- The letter from the medical doctor.
- The Statement of Consent of Minor if the minor is 10 years old or older.
- A Statement of Inability to Afford Payment of Court Costs form (if you want to ask that filing fees be waived)
- Exhibit: A copy of the Sex Offender Update Form (if the minor is required to register as a sex offender).

**Note:** You can file the Petition online at www.eFileTexas.gov.

- 1. Fill out, sign, and scan the Petition, exhibits, and proposed Order.
- 2. Include instructions in the Comments section that you would like your paperwork forwarded to the court for consideration.
- 3. Bring the original documents with you if meet with the judge.

# Step 4. Pay the Filing Fee.

You will **pay a filing fee** of about \$350 at the District Clerk's Office.

If paying the fee will create a financial hardship for you and your family, you may file a *Statement of Inability to Afford Payment of Court Costs* form to ask the Court to waive court and filing fees.

# Step 5. Learn where and when to go to court.

Travis County Prioritizes Name and Gender Identifier cases, but they do take some time to process. The average time for Name and Gender Identifier case to be finished is around Four Months. Once the Judge signs your order, the court will send you a Notice of Order. These notices are sent through email or postal mail. If you have reached

the 4-month mark without any contact from the Court, or if you have concerns about your filing, you can contact the Travis County Law Library to look into your case. After four months have passed since the original or any subsequent amended filings, we can reach out to the clerk's office on your behalf. Law Library: 512-854-8677.

# Step 7. Get certified copies of the Order.

Go to the District Clerk's Office, 1700 Guadalupe St., 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. The Clerk's Office stamps the Order signed by the judge. Ask for a **certified copy** of the signed and stamped Order. Pay the fee for the certified copy. You will need the certified copies to prove that the Court ordered the identifier change. You may want to get at least 3 certified copies.

# Step 8. Notify.

Notify agencies of the identifier change. You may be required to show them a certified copy of the court order. Agencies to notify include the:

- The minor's school
- Social Security Administration
- Vital Statistics (birth certificates)
- Department of Public Safety (driver's license or ID card)
- Passport Office

# **Questions: Gender Marker/Sex Identifier Change**

### Q: Who can use these forms?

A: This form is intended for use by parents or conservators who want to change a minor's sex identifier on public documents to match the minor's gender identity. If you want to change the minor's name AND gender marker only, there are separate forms for that. There are also separate forms if you want to just change the minor's name.

# Q: The other parent/non-parent conservator will not sign these forms. What can I do?

A: These forms are intended to be used in *uncontested* cases. This means that the minor and any adult with a legal relationship to the minor agree to the change and will sign the forms.

If an adult with a legal relationship to the minor refuses to sign these forms *and notifies court*, then your case is *contested*. It is always best to have an attorney help you in a contested case. For more information on giving legal notice to an opposing party and setting a contested case for hearing, check out the TexasLawHelp.org website.

If an adult with a legal relationship to the minor refuses to sign these forms but does NOT notify the court, then your case may be a default. Read more about default family law cases on the TexasLawHelp.org website.

If the minor's other parent is dead or a court has terminated their parental rights, check box 3A, "There is no respondent." Attach a copy of the death certificate or order terminating the parental rights when you file the *Petition*.

If, after really looking hard, you cannot find the other adult who has a legal relationship to the minor, check the box under 3B "I cannot find the Respondent." Read and follow the instructions at <a href="TexasLawHelp.org">TexasLawHelp.org</a> on how to give legal notice to a respondent by publication. You will need to hire a lawyer to serve as attorney ad litem for the respondent.

- Q: Can I change the minor's gender/sex marker on public documents without going to court?
- A: No. In Texas, you need a court order. Judges have discretion to either grant or deny your request.
- Q: Is surgery or other medical treatment or procedure required before the minor's gender/sex marker can change?
- A: No, Texas law does not require surgery. What is required is a narrative statement from a medical doctor that says:
  - The doctor has examined the minor.
  - The minor has received appropriate clinical treatment for transitioning.
  - It is in the minor's best interest (it is recommended) that the minor's sex and/or gender marker be changed in public records to be consistent with the minor's identity and presentation.

In exercising their discretion to grant sex/gender marker changes, judges often look to the Current Standards of Care (SOC) established by the World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH). For more information on these standards, see <a href="https://www.wpath.org/publications/soc">https://www.wpath.org/publications/soc</a>

- Q: Can I change the minor's gender/sex marker to non-binary or some other identity that is neither male or female (M or F)?
- A: No. Texas law does not recognize non-binary, third gender or gender fluid as an acceptable entry for sex or gender that is printed on state identification documents.
- Q: Will the minor's identity documents automatically be updated once the court enters an order?
- A: No. Getting an order is just the first step of the process of correcting the gender marker on ID documents. You will need to contact the issuing authority for each type of ID and present a certified copy of the court order when you ask for a change. You can get a certified copy of the order signed by the judge from the District Clerk's Office, 1700 Guadalupe St., 3<sup>rd</sup> floor.

Although the order is a binding order of a Texas district court of general jurisdiction, it is not an absolute guarantee that state entities will immediately adjust the gender marker in accordance with the order.
